

Business Turf to Native Grass Conversion

Overview

 To encourage business customers to cultivate more attractive, resilient landscapes, we offer an incentive for converting low-use areas to alternative or native grass species.

Why are native grass conversions a great option?

- They are one of the most cost-effective water and maintenance reduction options available.
- They can revitalize older landscapes to better serve customers and allow more appropriate allocation of water and maintenance resources towards higher priority areas.
- Conversion to native grass can yield water savings up to 80% over conventionally irrigated Kentucky bluegrass.

What is the rebate amount provided?

Rebates incentive is **\$0.50 per square foot** for approved grass species or mixtures.

What should I know before getting started?

- Review rebate participation steps, eligibility criteria and <u>program</u> rules.
- Choose an eligible grass species or mixture.
- Include seed label with application to verify grass species used.
- Schedule a post project inspection with a Colorado Springs Utilities staff person to confirm correct grass species and sufficient germination.

- Buffalograss
- Blue grama grass
- Buffalograss and blue grama mix
- Qualified Mixes
- Custom Mix

Which mixes qualify?

- Pawnee Buttes Native Prairie Mix
- Buffalo Brand Native Turf Mix
- Western Native Seed Shortgrass Prairie Grasses
- El Paso County Conservation District -Native Grass Mix

What time of year should I plan my native grass conversion installation?

Native grass conversions are best installed June-August depending on grass species. If this timeline does not work speak to a horticulturalist.
